SUSTAINABILITY

ISSUE: RENEWABLE ENERGY

CF# 21-0352 (KREKORIAN/O'FARRELL) – 03/31/2021

ENERGY, CLIMATE CHANGE, ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE & RIVERS COMMITTEE

IN SUPPORT OF THE MOTION to “instruct the Department of Water and Power to prepare a Strategic Long Term Resource Plan that achieves 100% carbon-free energy by 2035, in a way that is equitable and has minimal adverse impact on ratepayers.” This Strategic Long Term Resource Plan should “prioritize equity for environmental justice communities, defined as those scoring at or above the 80th percentile on CaiEnviroScreen.” The Chief Legislative Analyst should “report on the ‘no-regrets’ projects that are common to all LA 100 paths and present an accelerated pathway to launch and complete those projects. This report should include a list of ‘shovel-ready’ projects that DWP can be ready to act on in order to seize on Federal and State funding opportunities.”

[S. 1459 “would increase protections for over 1 million acres of federal public lands throughout Northwest California, the Central Coast, and Los Angeles, including nearly 600,000 acres of new wilderness, more than 583 miles of new wild and scenic rivers, and the expansion of an existing national monument by more than 100,000 acres.”]
